In addition to air sampling, which showed no combustible gas in the home, water sample results from an independent lab indicate that the water is well within safe drinking water standards and that the samples show no evidence of dissolved methane. This series of orchestrated events not only caused unnecessary concern in the community but created a dangerous situation by wasting resources of the emergency personnel who responded.

We seek, as a company and as individuals, always to act with integrity, transparency and honesty. We are steadfast in our willingness to engage in a fact-based discussion about our industry and our company. We are proud of the substantial investment we have made in Potter County. And we are grateful for the support we have received from the vast majority of its residents. We look forward to continuing to work with these folks toward the goal of an energy-independent America.
